Control Arms Foundation of India (CAFI) was established on 10 September 2004 by a group of concerned citizens on the strong belief that lasting peace and security can be achieved in India and South Asia. CAFI is committed to find solutions to end armed conflicts and violence in the region caused by the unregulated proliferation of small arms and light weapons. CAFI initiates informed debates and discussion on all issues regarding the use of force, disarmament and security. CAFI calls for the least diversion of the world's human and economic resources for armaments to establish and maintain peace as enshrined in article 26 of the United Nations Charter. CAFI firmly believes that the UN Millennium Development Goals can be achieved if the menace of armed violence and the need for poverty reduction are jointly addressed. Therefore, CAFI closely relates disarmament and development issues as a true manifestations of human security. Putting people first is our fundamental approach CAFI raises public awareness about the detrimental impact of armed violence as well as gun-related violent attitudes and behaviors to the safety of society and to development prospects. CAFI organizes discussion rounds and seminars as an open dialogue forum between government officials and members of civil society. CAFI encourages and supports partnerships between community groups, government agencies and authorities, non-governmental organizations, civil society as well as the private sector to develop and implement effective targeted small arms reduction and sustainable development measures. Delhi Disarmament Conference event consisted of civil society workshops, rally, peace vigils, music concert and 2 days of experts' conference on the United Nations Arms Trade Treaty with the support of more than 20 partner organizations from various civil society organizations, think tanks and participants came from across the country including survivors of gun violence and landmine victims. Women Parliamentarian Briefing Session on UN Arms Trade Treaty and Other Humanitarian Disarmament Treaties, 2 December 2010, Constitution Club, New Delhi

Parliamentarians from all regions have for many years voiced their concerns about the spread of conventional weapons which exacerbate conflicts and instability, facilitate terrorist attacks, undermine development, and contribute to serious violations of human rights & humanitarian law. Control Arms Foundation of India have been organised briefing for Parliamentarian on Arms Treaty since 2006 even Women parliamentarian have been part of this process. More than

15 Women Parliamentarians gave their support for the Arms Trade Treaty, In total 72 parliamentarian have given their support to our work.

North East Women Initiative for Peace

For more than a century women and women's organizations and movements have mobilized in support of social empowerment, economic justice, democracy, human rights and conflict prevention. The Northeast of India comprising of the eight states of Assam,

Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Tripura and Sikkim is facing the onslaught of multiple armed conflicts since the late 1940s. No other part of India or South Asia has been subjected to such a prolonged violent struggle, which have held development to ransom, as the Northeast. The fire of insurgency has for long engulfed this strategic region for the last half a century or more making it one of the South Asia's most disturbed regions.

Civil society organizations, women activists, youth and violence survivors from the Northeast, scholars, parliamentarians and members of several think tanks and policy makers came together for the Fourth Conclave of Northeast India Women Initiative for Peace during a two day meet at India International Center in New Delhi held on 19th and 20th January 2011.

Humanitarian Disarment Entry into Force of Convention on Cluster Munitions: Press Conference and Drumming Event at India Gate, 2 August 2010, Press Club of India

On 30 May 2008, the Convention on Cluster Munitions was concluded by the Dublin Diplomatic Conference on Cluster Munitions. The Convention prohibits all use, stockpiling, production and transfer of cluster munitions, as defined in the Convention. The Convention also addresses assistance to

victims, clearance of contaminated areas and destruction of stockpiles. Furthermore, it includes transparency measures as well as guidance to address possible compliance issues. After 1 August 2010, the treaty obligations become legally binding for all states that have ratified.



Crafting Human Security: Envisioning India's Position at United Nations Arms Trade Treaty Preparatory Meeting, 2 March, 2011 Round Table Discussion

The second session of the Preparatory Committee for the United Nations Conference on the Arms Trade Treaty (ATT Prep Com) took place in New York from 28 February to 4 March 2011. This session built on the work undertaken during the first session was held in July 2010.



To coincide with the Second Prep Com at New Delhi on 2 March 2011, a Round Table Discussion was organized at Control Arms Foundation of India office, which looked into the various issues of armament, disarmament and non-proliferation efforts that have held the attention of the world and India. Control Arms Foundation of India has been urging the Government of India to support the process of to the United Nations Arms Trade Treaty.

UNSC 1325, Women & Humanitarian Disarmament: Manipur Women Gun Survivors Network

CAFI has been spearheading efforts of women led disarmament. Major work is done in Manipur. Manipur is a small state in India's North East that has been witnessing low intensity conflict since the late 1940s. More than 20,000 have been killed and until date, Manipur is one of the most conflict-ridden states

in India. Women and children suffer most, They bear the brunt of the emotional and socio-economic impact of violence. CAFI supports the work of the Manipur Women Gun Survivors Network that was founded on 24th December 2004. The Network attempts to help women, whose lives have dramatically changed by the gun killing of a family member by enabling them to start a small production unit or other business venture. So far the Network has helped more than 100 women by providing them with micro-finance in form of interest free loans of Rupees 3000 to 9000 (USD 75 to 225). With the help of this money the women are able to start and carry on work related to silk reeling, weaving or agriculture.
